

Director's Report

July 2023 - June 2024

This year has seen the Jubilate Singers developing various singing and choral skills. We have been working on intonation, ensemble singing skills, singing in languages other than English, and singing in styles that represent the music's origins. We have also been blessed to have many wonderfully talented groups and musicians to work with this year.

The year from July started with a successful unaccompanied performance of Renaissance music at Blackheath Choir Festival. The choir did a fantastic job stylistically and maintained poise and intonation throughout the performance.

We embarked on a role the choir had never taken before. Strathfield Symphony Orchestra invited us to partner with Excelsia Chamber Choir to present a program of Star Wars Themes, along with other movie soundtracks. Singing soundtracks is a very different skill where the choir is part of an accompaniment rather than a feature. This was a difficult artistic shift for the choir, but we banded together and committed to seeing through to the outcome. Everyone who took part in the performance was delighted they persevered!

We enjoyed more collaborative firsts in November when we performed together with Warren Choir, accompanied by string orchestra, piano and solo guitar, The Lake Isle by Ola Gjeilo at the Symphonia Jubilate 10th Anniversary concert. We also enjoyed learning a beautiful Christmas carol by Ruth McCall for the Holy Trinity Church Dulwich Hill Christmas Advent Service in early December, along with *Ubi Caritas*, also by Ola Gjeilo.

The beginning of 2024 brought a strong focus on Schubert Mass In G, which we presented in May, working with very talented quests. David Drury, and young emerging operatic soloists Aidan O'Donnell, Eden Shifroni, and Michael Kaufmann. Our own extremely talented accompanist, Anna Tomasyshyn, delivered very moving performances of Schubert lieder with the soloists. The concert went amazingly well, given we had a reduced time to rehearse.

Overall, it was a rich year of learning, and we were very fortunate to have worked with many wonderful musicians within and around our community.

I would like to express appreciation for the dedication of our President, Cheryl Fowler, who has, with help from our wonderful committee, seen that all aspects behind the scenes are looked after to the finest detail, and ensured all organisational aspects run smoothly. We are all very grateful for her work.
